ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2022-6

Re: Audio Recorded Sessions for Training Purposes

The U.S. Probation Office in the District of Kansas was selected by the Probation and Pretrial Services Office (PPSO) to work with the Active Implementation Research Network (AIRN), National Implementation Team (NIT), and local District Implementation Team (DIT). The Probation Office will be working on an implementation model to support the full and effective use of evidence-based practices by all officers and supervisors in the district and to assure effective administrative supports for achieving continuously improved outcomes for defendants and persons under supervision.

During the course of training, officers may be asked to conduct audio recorded sessions with defendants and persons on supervision as a means of receiving support and feedback on their use of skills. This form of coaching is on the job teaching and learning designed to expand the fundamental skills taught during training.

Therefore, upon request of Scott Jones, Chief U.S. Probation Officer for the District of Kansas, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED, the U.S. Probation Office may utilize audio recordings with defendants and persons on supervision exclusively for training purposes. Any defendant or person on supervision participating in an audio recorded exercise will be asked to provide consent to be recorded and be advised their participation is voluntary. Training recordings will not be disseminated to any party not directly involved in the training initiative outside the U.S. Probation Office. Recorded sessions will be saved in an Administrative Office (AO) supported repository and deleted after 90 days.
