Responses to Summary Judgment and Daubert Motions	Friday, August 9, 2019, or 42 days after the filing of such a motion
Replies in Support of Summary Judgment and Daubert Motions	Friday, August 30, 2019, or 21 days after the filing of a response

Also, the court adopts the parties' proposal for briefing page limits for dispositive motions and *Daubert* motions.

The following page limits apply to a party's entire dispositive motion brief (except Table of Contents and Table of Authorities):

• Opening Briefs: 50 pages

• Responses: 50 pages

• Rule 56.1 Statement of Material Facts: 50 pages

• Reply Briefs: 25 pages

The following page limits apply to a party's entire *Daubert* brief (except Table of Contents and Table of Authorities):

Opening Briefs: 25 pages<sup>1</sup>

• Responses: 25 pages

• Reply Briefs: 15 pages
