CONDITIONAL TRANSFER ORDER (CTO-2)

On August 23, 2004, the Panel transferred 15 civil actions to the United States District Court for the District of Kansas for coordinated or consolidated pretrial proceedings pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1407. Since that time, six additional actions have been transferred to the District of Kansas. With the consent of that court, all such actions have been assigned to the Honorable John W. Lungstrum.

It appears that the action on this conditional transfer order involves questions of fact which are common to the actions previously transferred to the District of Kansas and assigned to Judge Lungstrum.

Pursuant to Rule 7.4 of the Rules of Procedure of the Judicial Panel on Multidistrict Litigation, 199 F.R.D. 425, 435-36 (2001), this action is transferred under 28 U.S.C. § 1407 to the District of Kansas for the reasons stated in the order of August 23, 2004, 333 F.Supp.2d 1379 (J.P.M.L. 2004), and, with the consent of that court, assigned to the Honorable John W. Lungstrum.

This order does not become effective until it is filed in the Office of the Clerk of the United States District Court for the District of Kansas. The transmittal of this order to said Clerk shall be stayed fifteen (15) days from the entry thereof and if any party files a notice of opposition with the Clerk of the Panel within this fifteen (15) day period, the stay will be continued until further order of the Panel.
