

If you are suing a city, county, or agency of the Kansas government



The Kansas law (specifically, K.S.A. § 60-304(d)) says that when you sue a Kansas state defendant, you will need to serve summonses on specific persons depending upon what type of entity you are suing. They are:

1. **A county**: by serving one of the county commissioners, the county clerk or the county treasurer of that county.
2. **A township**: by serving the clerk of the township or a trustee.
3. **A city**: by serving the clerk or the mayor of that city.
4. **The state of Kansas or any government agency of the state**: by serving the attorney general or an assistant attorney general. The address for the Kansas Attorney general is:

5. **Any other public corporation, political body, district or authority**: by serving the clerk or secretary of the organization or, if the clerk or secretary is not found, any officer, director or manager.
